## Proposal for Socio-economic Analysis for Northern Manitoba and First Nations Communities for the Needs for and Alternatives to (NFAT) Review

We see 3 main components to our analysis:

- 1. Evaluation of the socio-economic costs and benefits of the Keeyask and Conawapa Generating Stations for Northern Manitoba (largely Gillam and Thompson) and the surrounding First Nations communities (this will involve overlap with our report for the Clean Environment Commission (CEC)).
- 2. Evaluation of the socio-economic costs and benefits of alternatives to the Keeyask and Conawapa Generating Stations for Northern Manitoba and the surrounding First Nations communities.
- 3. Evidence from fieldwork
