1 LEI testimony (p. 6766-6900)

1.1 Page 6775

Line 1 of page 6775 of the transcript reads "...individual farms may."

This should read "...individual farms may **vary**."

1.2 Page 6777

Lines 3-5 on page 6777 of the transcript reads "...we note that the timeline for that need has been repeatedly deferred 2024 and 2017, 2030 and 2015 2035 in 2016."

This should instead read "...we note that the timeline for that need has been repeatedly deferred **to** 2024 in 2017, **to** 2030 **in** 2015, **and** 2035 in 2016."

1.3 Page 6858

Lines 16-21 on page 6858 of the transcript reads "MS. PATTI RAMAGE: Now if I was to revise you, and I don't think you will this difficult to accept that it took roughly eight (8) years from the signing of Agreements In Principle with Manitoba Hydro's Cree Nation partners to negotiate the terms of the joint Keeyask development agreement"

1.4 Page 6859

Lines 6-7 of page 6859 of the transcript reads "It has, I presume, its own government structure and there's no doubt that it would take time to negotiate..."

1.5 Page 6873

Line 25 of page 6873 of the transcript reads "LEI I believes that Manitoba..."

This should instead read "LEI believes that Manitoba..."

Lines 4-7 of page 6882 of the transcript reads “...one (1) of the challenges of doing the OPG study was that they were merged more unique with regards to both the nature of the regulatory framework and their asset base.”
