RE: CENTRA GAS MANITOBA INC. ("CENTRA") 2019/20 GENERAL RATE APPLICATION – INFORMATION REQUESTS OF INTERVENER EVIDENCE

By letter of June 27, 2019, the Public Utilities Board of Manitoba ("PUB") requested that all parties, aside from Centra, provide their positions on which, if any issues, should be the subject of oral evidence together with reasons for such positions by July 5, 2019. In addition, and to assist in the advancement of its consideration of the issues for oral evidence, the PUB requested Centra to provide all parties with an indication of the subjects or areas on which it anticipates it will pose information requests ("IRs") in advance of July 5th. Centra's assessment of the areas that it expects to pose IRs is provided in this letter.

Intervener evidence has been filed by the following parties in this proceeding:

- Consumers Association of Canada (Manitoba) ("CAC"):
 - o Evidence prepared by Darren Rainkie & Kelly Derksen
 - Evidence prepared by Richard DeWolf
 - o Evidence prepared by METSCO
- Industrial Gas Users:
 - o Evidence prepared by Andrew McLaren of InterGroup Consultants Ltd.
 - Evidence prepared by Gil Labonte of France Financial Consulting
 - Evidence prepared by Troy Brown (Koch Energy Services, LP)
- Koch Fertilizer Canada, ULC (Koch):
 - Evidence prepared by Brian Collins (public redacted copy only).

Centra's overall assessment is that the intervener evidence filed largely contains argument and recommendations with limited facts or supporting analysis, many of which relate to future

periods outside of the test year. As such, Centra expects to file a minimal number of IRs seeking clarification on any facts/analysis that are unclear. Further, no significant facts appear to be in dispute with respect to its Application, and the current record for all of the issues raised by these Interveners is complete and sufficiently robust. For the same reasons, Centra does not expect to file extensive rebuttal evidence, but will focus on addressing intervener recommendations and alternatives.

In addition to the general comments noted above, Centra offers the following specific comments on the evidence filed by Interveners:

- With respect to the evidence of Richard Dewolf, Centra can advise that is does not expect to ask any information requests. Centra notes that the PUB has provided an opportunity for CAC and Centra to provide submissions on Tab 9 issues by July 15th.
- Based on the public, redacted version of the evidence filed by Mr. Collins, Centra is of
 the view that the positions advanced by this Intervener Consultant are to recommend a
 coincident peak and direct cost allocation alternative for the PUB's consideration, which
 is primarily argument. Accordingly, Centra expects to have a limited number of IRs to
 seek clarification on these positions. Centra reserves the right to ask IRs on any
 additional evidence that may be filed in accordance with Order 91/19.
- Regarding the evidence of METSCO, Centra can advise that it intends to ask a limited number of IRs seeking clarification with respect to the recommendations for specific projects for further consideration by the PUB and Centra.
- Regarding the evidence of Mr. McLaren, Centra will only seek to clarify his
 recommendation to defer any rate adjustments until after a full cost of service review,
 and his alternative related to the disposition of the heating value deferral.
- Regarding the cost of service and rate design evidence advanced by Ms. Derksen, Centra
 notes that this consultant's recommendations are clear and indicate that Centra's long
 standing cost allocation methodology is reasonable in light of the design and operations
 of its system, is principled and accepted industry practice. As such, Centra intends to
 pose a limited number of IRs primarily relating to the recommendation to reinstate the
 minimum margin guarantee for the Power Station class.
- Regarding the evidence of Mr. Rainkie, Centra intends to ask limited IRs related to his
 recommendation on Operating & Administrative expenses, and does not intend to ask
 any IRs on the evidence relating to recommendations for future periods beyond the test
 year in this Application, the majority of which overlap with the enterprise wide strategic
 planning process that is underway.
- With respect to the issue of load balancing fees, given that the record is fulsome on this
 matter, IRs will be limited to clarifying the record and further understanding the
 arguments/recommendations advanced by interveners.
