Response

During the Efficiency Manitoba Plan hearing on January 14, Chairperson Gabor asked Consumers Coalition witness Mr. Grevatt to identify energy efficiency portfolios that he views as providing accessible energy efficiency opportunities for residential customers. The following, in no particular order, provide examples of portfolios that are offered to a mid-sized residential customer base in a variety of climates. These program administrators may differently prioritize the end uses that they target, yet all provide accessible opportunities for residential customers, in Mr. Grevatt's view, because they offer a variety of programs that are easy to find, available, and that address a range of opportunities at different levels of investment and effort, including opportunities for comprehensive energy efficiency projects.
